What Does the Parish Council Do?

Maureen Gibbins, Clerk to Oxted Parish Council, tells us about its work:

A Parish Council is the most junior level of local government, so it has only limited powers and resources. Oxted Parish Council has existed for over 100 years and has 12 councillors, 6 from Oxted North and 6 from Oxted South, each elected for 4 years. Its income is £28,000 a year, which works out to £5.67 a year for a Band D Council Tax payer.

Care of the Burial Ground is an important responsibility and the Parish Council has the legal duty to keep proper burial records. The Parish Council is responsible for looking after the Parish notice boards. The Council must be consulted about planning applications; the Planning Committee meets every 3 weeks and members of the public are very welcome to attend.

An important function is to make grants to suitable local causes. In recent times Oxted Guide Hut appeal, 1st Hurst Green Scouts, St Catherine's Hospice, The Bluehouse Festival, Oxted Young Person's Theatre, repairs to the wall at St Mary's Church, Age Concern and the local Citizens Advice Bureau have all benefited. This is an important part of the work; if you represent a local organisation and would like to apply for a grant you should contact the Clerk.

Your Parish Councillors are always there to help you. If the Parish Council does not deal with your concerns they will try to direct you to someone who can help.

Who?...Me?

Can you remember that terrible feeling when your child goes to school for the first time? You go home feeling lost, the house is empty, deserted and quiet. There is an indescribable emptiness, although you know that this will not last for ever.

There are hundreds of people who every day have that emptiness, all day and every day. Perhaps their partner has died, so living with the loss of a companion makes the emptiness hard to bear. Days seem endless and loneliness is a bitter pill to swallow. Perhaps home carers call each day but they have work to do - not much time to talk; others are waiting for their attention. In the road outside, the chatter of young children punctuates the silence as they rush to school, chattering with their friends. The road becomes quiet again, except for the slamming of car doors as the neighbours go about their business. Will they call round? Family life has changed over the years, so that now children no longer stay in their own area when becoming adults, but move to other parts of the country, leaving parents isolated.

Maybe you are the very person who would enjoy making a regular visit to someone living alone? Over time, the relationship would prove beneficial to you both. The local voluntary service council would put you in touch with an organisation dealing with people in need of a friendly chat. This only needs to be a commitment of an hour, once a week. You would be amazed how much difference this could make to a person's life. To know that they will be having a visitor once a week makes the week more bearable and gives an excitement to the otherwise endless passing of time.

Having decided to be come a 'befriender', you will be joining a growing band of people who volunteer their time to help make this corner of Surrey a better place to live in. Crowhurst Parish

St John's Hurst Green is to be joined with St George's Crowhurst, our near neighbours but almost a foreign land. Over the centuries there have been few links between the two parishes, and as so often the reasons lie in the landscape. Hurst Green was at the southern end of the long narrow Oxted parish that reached all the way to the North Downs, providing a mixture of resources for our farming ancestors. The southern natural boundary is Gibbs Brook, beyond which lay the heavy clay soils of the Weald. The name Weald means "wooded", it was part of the great impenetrable forest that stretched across southern England.

Crowhurst is not mentioned in Domesday Book, it is first recorded in 1189, becoming a parish during the 13th century. Crowhurst began with a few hardy farmers carving out land from the forest; there never was a village centre. Many of the lovely historic farmhouses are still family homes today. It was still very wild in the 14th century when Lord Cobham hunted wolves in the area. Gradually more farms were settled and some larger houses built, notably Crowhurst Place in 1450, and Mansion House Farm opposite the church developed from about 1613.

The main industry was brick making with two major brickworks, the Tandridge Brick and Tile works near the Brickmakers Arms (now The Griffin,) and the Crowhurst works further south. When the railway came in 1884 the Crowhurst works had a rail link and stayed in business until 1979, but the other works did not survive.

The school was opened in 1862 and included a night school for children old enough to be at work. An important focus in the village, it closed in 1973, but is still remembered with great affection. The village hall is a busy hub of local life; the present hall was built in 1967 to replace one which became Oxted library before the new block.

By 2013 the old geographical isolation had gone; the bishop deploying his forces saw only a line on a map. St John's and St George's now share their priest, beginning the next chapter in our parishes' story. *Kath McCarthy*

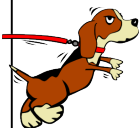
