The Bible speaks of being generous and sharing what we have, not placing our hope in earthly things but on things eternal, being content with what we have. I have concluded that it is not our possessions that really matter but our attitude to them.

New building in Hurst Green - have your say

Tandridge District Council wants residents to help with its 20-year development plan. This means that your views are very important to the future development of Tandridge District. The Council has commissioned a report which calls for 1,200 more houses to be built in the Oxted/Limpsfield/Hurst Green area; it is claimed that this is the figure needed to cope with migration from London. Effectively this means that London will grow out into Tandridge. Each of our towns would almost double in size to cope with this huge amount of housing. If residents of Hurst Green and Oxted wish to have a say in the future of Tandridge, your views are wanted before 26 February 2016.

You can look at the full draft of the local plan online at www.tandridge.gov.uk/localplan. The deadline for views to be sent to the Council is 26 February - not very long. *Marion Barker*

Development in Hurst Green

The most pressing issue facing Hurst Green right now is the Tandridge District Council development plan. The Streetlife website (www.bit.ly/HurstGreen) has generated a lot of discussion and it includes a map showing at a glance the EIGHT sites in Hurst Green included in Appendix 3 of the Local Plan, called 'Deliverable and Developable Sites'. They are at:

1. Mill Lane playing field;
2. Three in Holland Road, opposite, behind and further down from the Diamond;
3. Two sites west of Pollards Wood Road, adjacent to the Boulthurst Way area;
4. Two sites in Red Lane, just beyond Juniper Close.

Fairtrade for Breakfast.....

Fairtrade fortnight begins this year on 29 February, when we try to think a bit harder about how to give the poor people who produce so much of what we use a fairer share of the proceeds.



Last year the campaign concentrated on bananas and the huge difference buying Fairtrade bananas can have on the farmers' lives. This year breakfast is the theme. In one small and often hasty meal perhaps we can spare a thought for all those people all over the world who brought it to us. We use tea probably from India or Africa, coffee from South America or Africa, cereals from all over the world and yes bananas, from South America or the Caribbean.

If you buy Fairtrade for these everyday items you too can help to bring a poor farmer and the family out of near starvation, to live in a world where they themselves will not starve, and where their children have a chance for an education. This year Fairtrade profiles Rahel Mhabuka, a tea picker in Tanzania; Rahel also tends a small plot of land to grow maize to feed herself and her family. When the tea estate where she works joined Fairtrade, Rahel could buy subsidised fertiliser and now produces ten times as much maize from her plot. This provides enough food for her family for the whole year with a little spare to sell for much needed cash.

Fairtrade sells a huge range of goods but breakfast items are things we use every day. Buying Fairtrade when we are shopping is not a big change to make, but it would have a big impact on the lives of so many people worldwide.

Women's World Day of Prayer is an international movement that invites women, from a different part of the world each year, to prepare a service through which their hopes and fears for their country can be brought to the whole world in prayer. The day begins as the sun rises over Samoa and ends 35 hours later when it sets over American Samoa.

This year the service has been written by women in Cuba and translated into 60 languages and 1,000 dialects. The theme is 'Receive children, receive me' (St Mark's Gospel ch. 10 vv13-16) which is a reminder that everyone is a child of God and equally worthy of our love and respect.

The day of prayer is not just for women, everyone is welcome to attend the non-denominational service. Locally services are at 10am at St Peter's Limpsfield and 7.30pm at All Saints Oxted. There are Refreshments available after both services.

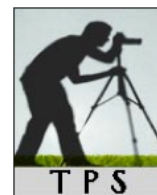
