

Tribute to Tony Pinner

On the morning of Tony's funeral, the church of St John's in Hurst Green was packed to the rafters, with people arriving over an hour before the service at 12 noon, to make sure of a seat. There were parking problems, made worse by the new development at the end of the lane.

Ladies were busy preparing the refreshment for after the service, and standard bearers from the local British Legion were getting ready to lead the funeral procession. Tony's brother-in-law and nephews led the small family gathering.

More and more people arrived to add to the throng. The church was getting very crowded, the choir stalls were filled with people, and extra chairs were placed around the altar, and around the font at the other end of the church. But still people came, some having to stand at the back.

Tony's coffin was carried into church to Lonnie Donegan's 'Putting on the style', since Tony had played in a skiffle group. The Revd Mary Seller led the service in her usual calm way. Many stories were recounted about Tony, his old van, his love of animals, especially foxes, the tree in his garden that he decorated with lights at Christmas, and above all, his generosity and kindness - how he would fix someone's broken window and forget to charge them. His coffin left the church to Lonnie Donegan's 'Have drink on me'.

It was a wonderful tribute. It seemed as if the whole village wanted to show how much Tony was loved and respected, and how very much everyone was going to miss him. *Pearl Hobson*

Mighty Oaks Youth Club

It hardly seems possible, but we celebrated our sixth birthday the other day. The club thrives in its own particular way. For some of us, the stimulus that got it going was a very thorough, and disturbing, Report for Surrey Youth Crime Prevention Board about the situation in Hurst Green. Thirty adults and a lot of children had been quizzed for the Survey, and the report was published in April 2010. One of its main recommendations was that we should set up a Youth Club in the village.

With the help and guidance of folk from Surrey Services for Young People we went through all the processes for setting up the Club. Now we have about 100 youngsters on the roll, and 20 to 30 turn up on the regular Friday night meetings in the recently revamped Community Centre. The age range is from 10 to 13. The members pay a weekly subscription and there has been an ongoing fundraising campaign to supplement our income. Friday nights are what anybody would think of as a typical Youth Club programme, but that is not the end of the story. We organise a range of outings and events at other times that are very popular. The youngsters also take part in a number of community projects.

The whole venture relies on a dedicated group of volunteers, and we need to recruit willing helpers all the time to maintain our strength. We set ourselves the target of maintaining a ratio of one adult to every eight children on Friday nights. So please come along and join the team.
