Advent is traditionally a time of waiting. The Advent calendar or Advent wreath with four candles (cue the Two Ronnies) helps us mark that time of waiting as Christmas approaches. However I think we find waiting harder nowadays with so much available 'on demand'. Even today's Advent calendars help make the waiting more bearable by giving us gifts every day, (if you'd like to spend £30 for a cheese one or £40 for a make-up one, of course!)

That said, this whole year has forced waiting upon us. We are waiting for the pandemic to come to an end and life to return to normal. We are waiting for a vaccine to be found. We may have to wait for COVID test results. We may have had to self-isolate and find ourselves counting days until it ends. We may be waiting to see who we can be with at Christmas.

"The meaning is in the waiting" writes RS Thomas. The waiting of Advent this year will have a new depth, but what 'meaning' might we find? There are many things the pandemic has taught us but maybe one is how to live with uncertainty - something we also find hard when usually we seem to have a tight control on our lives.

If we turn our thoughts to the waiting in the Christmas story we are reminded that Mary and Joseph also lived with uncertainty. When the angel told Mary she was to give birth to God's son, Mary would have wondered, fearfully, how Joseph, her fiancé, might respond. When they travelled to Bethlehem their journey was risky. Would they make it? When they got there, were they going to find somewhere to stay? And though they were settled for a short while, quickly they had to flee for their lives as Herod got wind there was a new king in town and sent his soldiers to massacre any first born, baby boys. Life certainly wasn't all tinsel and fairy lights.

So as we wait for Christmas 2020, let's remember that Jesus was born into a family living with uncertainty. As Mary accepted her destiny from the Angel Gabriel she promised to trust God and yield to what lay ahead because she would not face it alone. "Nothing is impossible WITH God", she replied. Sadly due to current restrictions the Crib Services are unable to take place this year and Welcare cannot accept donations of food and toys. As an idea of how your money will help: £5 will provide nappies and wipes for a newborn for 3 days; £10 will provide nappies and wipes for a toddler for a week; £15 a board game for a family; £20 a warm coat and £30 a pair of school shoes. Donations are also used to pay for attendance at breakfast / after school clubs; a man with a van to move a family out of unsuitable accommodation; or a bus pass for a family to get to school, for example.

YOGA for Your life – Body, Mind, Breath and Spirit

Breathing forms one of the fundamentals of all Yogic work. Breath is life! Breathing techniques (pranayama) can increase capacity and energy, improve control of your breathing, and allow the body to work in harmony with the breath. It has been shown that pranayama can reduce blood pressure when practised regularly, and some of the techniques are bringing relief to those with complications from COVID-19 and other respiratory conditions.



Some of the most beneficial aspects of yoga for modern living, and particularly at this time with so many changes and challenges, can be found in the practices of meditation and mindfulness, along with the rejuvenating and healing effects of deep relaxation (Restorative Yoga). Through developing a deeper awareness of the connections between the body and mind, and by practising techniques that have proven to be effective, everyone can develop an understanding of how they think and feel, and how to begin to take control of those thoughts and feelings which no longer serve you. This will allow you to move towards a more fulfilled and contented life.

The practice of Yoga needs to be done with commitment, willingness, and enthusiasm to discover more about you and what your body, mind and spirit yearn for.


In the meantime, consider the following good reasons to take up walking, which is the daily brain medicine we really need:

The making of a fabric map of Hurst Green and Holland: a Creative Community project during lockdown - Rachel Lickiss We had the idea to make a map at Hurst Green Fair in 2019, thinking it would be good to display in our gazebo. We wanted to include artwork by local residents but by the time we were ready to ask for this, lockdown had started.

I worked on the design and decided on a map about 90cm square plus borders for lettering and illustrations. The main road network was drawn out to this scale and then transferred to fabric which was stitched in place.

We put out an appeal for people to draw community buildings, their home, or indeed any other building in the villages. Later, we circulated a list of community buildings we still needed so that people could fill in the gaps. A drawing by everyone who contributed has been used, some to decorate the label on the back of the quilt as we could not have two of any one building on the map. Scans of the drawings were reduced to be only a few centimetres in each dimension. These were printed on specialist fabric and stitched to the map in approximately the correct location - the village centre got rather crowded!

Pictures of houses were stitched to the side borders and lettering applied to the top and bottom borders. The final stage was to use photographs of the projects and events run by Creative Community. These were printed onto fabric and attached in the space just inside the borders with threads indicating the location of projects in the villages.



We hope that events will again be possible next year and we will display the map at those. Other plans to display it or produce small versions of the design are also being considered.
