Save our frogs and toads!

Over the next few weeks you may catch sight of frogs and toads crossing the road near St John's Church close to the junction between Church Way and Oast Road.

What are the differences between frogs and toads? Frogs have smooth, moist skin and they aren't slimy! They tend to jump rather than crawl. Toads, on the other hand, have drier skin. They don't need to spend their lives so close to water. They lumber about when they move, instead of hopping.

Both frogs and toads, known as amphibians, because they live partly on land and partly in the water, travel back each year to the pond where they were bred. This happens in late winter/early spring, after it begins to get dark, often following a rainy day. They don't like the cold, so the temperature needs to be reasonably mild, otherwise they will stay put in someone's garden for a little longer, in their snug spot in the undergrowth, or a woodpile, or a hole in the ground. Then, when the conditions seem right, they set out on their journey - and they don't have any road sense!

So, from early or mid-February until early April there are likely to be frogs on roads and toads trying to cross Church Way and Oast Road near the T-junction in the hours after dusk. While we have a Toad Patrol in place to help them on their journey,

we don't have enough people to cover the whole of each evening. These little amphibians can be seen and avoided if we all drive slowly and carefully in that area. Please help us to spare God's creatures.

A handmade heart brings comfort

Pollards Oak WI member, Monica Fenton, who is part of the chaplaincy team at East Surrey Hospital, asked the committee if members might like to make small knitted or fabric hearts for the team as she had received a request from them that their supplies were running low. This is a nationwide initiative taken up by many hospitals. With so many Covid patients and others unable to have their families or loved ones visit them, two hearts are given out, one

to the patient and one to the family. Holding their respective hearts while making video or phone calls helps them to feel closer to each other and brings them comfort. And when not in touch, the hearts are a tangible reminder of the love that links them.

The committee thought this was a lovely idea and when members were asked for help the response was brilliant. Within about two weeks more than 100 hearts made from pretty fabrics were ready and Monica was able to take them to the hospital and present them to the Revd Vlada Rakin, one of the Chaplains in the chaplaincy team.

The WI had a lovely letter back thanking them for the hearts, saving they were very popular with the patients and were very much appreciated. Since then, Pollards Oak have made a further 88 hearts for Monica to take to the hospital. This appeal even went beyond the WI: a bag of pink knitted hearts were made by a member's neighbour who wanted to contribute to the collection and made 50! The members are continuing to make more hearts and they will be giving these to Monica for the hospital in the New Year.

Counting the Birds

When I was a toddler my Uncle Peter used to take me out in my pushchair. I still remember the thrill of him lifting me to see a robins' nest in the bank with four white speckled eggs in it! Later Uncle Peter taught me to recognise birds by their flight and thus a lifelong love of birds came about.

My late husband used to have a band of retired chaps to help maintain local woodlands. I was with them one morning and I heard a marsh tit. John, one of the men, said 'Are you interested in birds?' 'Very much so' I replied and he told me about the BTO (British Trust for Ornithology, www.bto.org). I applied and was gratefully recruited - the more, the merrier seems to be the norm!

I keep a weekly check of common birds on one sheet of paper and less common on another. Every 13 weeks an official form is filled out and sent to the BTO in Thetford, and I get a very interesting magazine four times a year, with the results of the surveys.

Maybe like me you grew up in a house with a coal fire and ice on the bedroom windows. Even though the coal was once a tree, the clinker is not much use in the garden except

or paths and drives. And maybe, like me, you now have a log fire as an extra source of heat in your house. Don't waste the wood ash. It is alkaline, but it can be used in the garden. If you are on clay, which is probably in the middle of acid/alkaline conditions (do get a testing kit to find out), the ash can be dressed over the winter soil and raked in. But do keep it away from the fruit garden, roses, rhododendrons, and other acid liking plants.

Moving on to the garden, I am sure you have all pruned your wisterias and shrubs by now. The snowdrop Ellwesii (my favourite) is the first to flower and is still in flower after weeks with other varieties trying to catch up. Mixed with the cyclamen coums, it is a picture under the leafless trees.

The pair of pigeons and collared doves have returned and are trying to sort out their previous nesting sites. Flocks of sparrows and blue tits come through twice a day joined by a mix of other birds for safety. Don't forget they need water as much as we do, so have several dishes around the garden of different sizes and depths, for washing and drinking. Keep them clean and ice free, as if you didn't have enough to do in your garden!

There is not much change in our Club programme for this year. The January meeting was on Zoom and February was scheduled as a practical demonstration, so cannot now go ahead. It took over two years to book the speaker we wanted for March but that now looks as if it will have to be delayed till next year. With current Covid restrictions, we will have to sort out the rest of this year's programme as best we can and we are now working on the 2022 programme too. Brian Parrott


