CHRISTIAN AID WEEK IN MAY: Thanks to your generosity a grand total, with Gift Aid, of £733 was raised: £411 from Church collection, £297 from the Big Brekkie and £25 from the Craft Day.

REPORT FROM THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL: The meeting of the new PCC on 21 June began with an 'interactive' reflection by the Rector. Members were asked what they appreciate about St John's (the people, feeling comfortable, the building, the grounds, worshipping together, stained glass windows) and the challenges (people coming infrequently making it hard to develop a relationship, encouraging people to return after the pandemic, getting volunteers, the money). This was then offered to God in prayer. We are advertising for a Youth Worker for the Oxted Team to start next term. The new filming equipment is now in place and thanks were recorded to Julian Taylor and Nigel Eltringham for all their work on this. Following the adoption of the Southwark Anti-Racism Charter, Lotwina Farodoye is hoping to run unconscious bias training in the autumn. A small group will review church noticeboards whilst another group will brainstorm fundraising events, as a targeted stewardship campaign is considered inappropriate in the current financial climate. Mary Seller lifted all the stones in the Memorial Garden in 2015 and this now urgently needs doing again as many are disappearing.

ECO-GROUP PLANS: The PCC considered a detailed report giving ideas for actions, based on the 'votes' from the services in March. Funding for some suggestions could come from a mission grant; the result of an application is awaited. It was agreed a refill service should be trialled on Sundays in July and August, with the possibility of this being extended to the wider community if successful.

THERAPEUTIC GARDEN VISIT, MONDAY 18 JULY: A visit has been arranged to the 'Therapeutic Garden' at St Mary's, Lewisham, to meet with their team, see what they've done, discuss, and hopefully, stimulate ideas about options for our own use of land.
