Welcome to St John's!

'You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit - fruit that will last'. John's Gospel chapter 15 verse 16

He and Revd Mary will guide us with our hard-working churchwardens, Cathy and Henk, until we know who will join us in the future.

INTERREGNUM UPDATE: The appointment (see above) on 11 September of James Ashton (former Team Vicar in the Oxted Team Ministry) as Team Rector of the Oxted Team Ministry, creates a vacancy for a Team Vicar who will be responsible for St John's and St George's. A parish profile which describes the sort of church we are and the sort of vicar we would like has been written and adverts have been placed on the Church of England recruitment website and on the Diocese of Southwark's website. Your elected parish representatives, Cathy Booth and Chris Johns, will be interviewing shortlisted candidates on Monday 25 September. Assuming we find someone appropriate, they will probably have to give three months notice from their current post and so it is unlikely that we will have anyone in place before early January 2024.

HURST GREEN VILLAGE FAIR: Saturday 16 September, 1 - 4pm, on the green by St Agatha's Hall. This year's theme is 'Magic'. For children, St John's will offer colouring sheets and the chance to make bird feeders; a free drink and biscuit to any child who litter picks for 10 - 15 mins (hi vis and litter picker provided) and the usual bouncy castle - please sign the rota if you can help with supervision!

DEFIBRILLATOR: As you know, Anna asked for some of the monies raised from her collection to go towards the cost of a defibrillator. We're delighted to report that we have raised enough money to make this happen and the defibrillator has now arrived and will be installed in a lockable cabinet in the church grounds.

CHANGES: From September Keeta Flexi-school will be hiring the York Rooms during term time in school hours; after Christmas they will also use St John's Room. Evening bookings are not affected but yoga classes and Tandridge Club for the Visually Impaired will transfer to St Agatha's. Yo Yos, the baby and toddler group, will be in the church (Wednesdays 9.15 - 11.15am) and need time to clear up, so the 4th Wednesday Eucharist will be at the later time of 12.30pm. The soup lunch following the service will resume in St John's Room on 25 October (cook unavailable in September!) and move to the church after Christmas, made possible by the installation of a kitchenette in the servers' vestry. The Fortnightly coffee morning will continue to meet in St John's Room until Christmas and after that will meet in the church. Anyone using St John's Room before Christmas will not have access to the York Rooms lobby toilet. Thank you to Sue Fox for her generous donation to the cost of a new communications board to keep congregation and visitors updated with the progress of 'Crossing the Threshold' plans.
