THE AUTUMN FAIR on Saturday 11 November raised £1,400 to go towards community based projects. Over 150 people attended and were able to buy beautiful home made crafts from local people such as cards, pottery, embroidery, jewellery, silk paintings, decoupage, knitted products and lots more. Tea and home made cake plus a raffle with amazing prizes which had been donated by local shops and businesses, all contributed to a marvellous day. There was a wonderful face painter for the children and Creative Community kindly hosted a peg doll making workshop. It was a lovely community event which we hope to repeat next year. Many thanks to all involved who worked so hard to make the day such a success.

REPORT FROM THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL: The PCC met on 16 November and agreed to the Crossing the Threshold's suggestion of a phased approach to the major building works proposed for St John's. Initially it seemed that Your Fund Surrey would cover most of the cost but this is no longer the case. It would also require upfront professional (including architect) fees of around £27,000 and using reserves is deemed inappropriate. Phase 1 might include replacing the old carpet with a hard floor; installing heaters to act independently of the central heating (heating the person not the space); modifications to the porch access and relocating the font. Plans would be reviewed and funding sought at each stage.

It was agreed that the congregation would be invited to share the Peace by waving or shaking hands with immediate effect. Both the Community Hub and Sunday School desperately need more volunteers. Please speak to Mary Seller or Cathy Booth if you could help with either, or with some of the many fabric tasks currently undertaken by Chris Johns.

The Service of Licensing and Installation for Revd Sue Bosley will be held on Tuesday 30 January at 7.30pm, with refreshments afterwards in the York Rooms. The next PCC meeting will be on 1 February, a week later than originally agreed, to enable Sue to attend.

OVER THE LAST FEW WEEKS three faithful members of St John's have passed away. Together with their families, we mourn their loss.

Brenda Cole

Brenda died at the age of 94 after years of failing health. In her time, she was a WI member, gardener, dinner party organiser and part of a vibrant social circle of a type that thrived in yesteryear. She was a quiet and friendly person who had a real sense of humour that made her able to laugh at everything. She radiated qualities of 'loveliness' and 'niceness' that made her someone who it was always good to see, and enjoy time with. Her late husband, Bill, was the inspiration behind the re-ordering of the interior of St John's after the fire. It was his idea to remove the screen and use it to make an enclosed area in the north transept, and to place the beautiful carved wooden cross from the top of the screen beneath the west window. Sadly, he died suddenly in 1989, before the restoration was completed.

Pat Conquest

Pat was a quiet, unassuming and modest person, a former teacher of Economics at Oxted School. She is perhaps best remembered on spring evenings on toad patrol in Oast Road. Warmly wrapped up, and armed with a torch and a bucket, she scooped up lovesick toads making their way across the road between the pond on one side, and the little river that flows near her house, to prevent them from being run over by cars. Pat's concern for God's creation was deep, and also included her love of bird watching and membership of the RSPB, her enjoyment of gardening, and of course, her love of dogs; her faithful Percy died not too long before she did. Pat was part of our 8 o'clock congregation, to which she contributed by being a sides-person and lesson reader. For some time she undertook the task of opening and closing the church each day.

Rob Chalmers

Rob died after a very long illness so nobly borne. How happy we were to see him only a week before, at the Act of Remembrance in the church grounds. Over many years Rob contributed so much to our church life, not only as a faithful member of the congregation, but also putting his many talents at our disposal as PCC member and by looking after the church fabric, and health and safety, and acting as a Server and Crucifer. On a wider front, he was one of our representatives on Deanery Synod. Rob was such a lovely, gentle man, who never sought the limelight, but his quiet personality and dry, Scottish wit endeared him to us all. There will be a Thanksgiving Service for Rob at St John's Church on Thursday 21 December at 2pm, followed by a reception in the York Rooms.

We are so thankful to God for giving these three treasures to us to know and to love. May the sorrow of parting turn into the joy of heaven, and may Brenda, Pat and Rob, all such faithful servants of the Lord, rest in peace for ever. *Mary*
