UPDATE: This is a brief summary of the current activities of the Crossing the Threshold ("CTT") sub-committee. We are in talks with several external organisations to bring community services to St John's. Negotiations are at an early stage so we cannot give details yet, but the services will address local needs as follows:

- services for job-seekers and help generally with benefits claims;
- activities/support for those living with dementia and their carers;
- a health-hub run by NHS services; and
- · support for mothers who are breast-feeding.

Some services may operate weekly others fortnightly/monthly. Each would need only one morning or afternoon in any week of operation so would fit around other activities already taking place at St John's. We expect that initially these services would be hosted in the York Rooms but eventually we envisage additional services/activities being in the main body of the church during some parts of the week. Each organisation will pay a hire-fee giving us much needed income.

We continue to work on building projects to improve access to and safety of the nave. After a positive meeting with the Diocesan Advisory Board, we have re-submitted our faculty application for the relocation of the font and the creation of a more distinct baptistry. The new artwork reusing the brass plaques from the old chairs and wood from the limed-oak table (currently under the window) will have a prominent position in the reordered area.

Soon we should also have appropriate quotes from builders for:

- creation of a new access ramp and levelling of the porch floor to give step-free access to the nave; and
- removal of the carpet in the aisles, Lady Chapel and entrance/ baptistry and restoration of the original quarry tiled/wooden floor.

Both of these projects will remove trip hazards and provide a more sustainable, hardwearing floor in the main body of the church. Finding suitable (and willing) builders has not been easy but we have now met with some excellent people. Once we have all the quotes, we will report to the PCC and will be ready to submit grant funding applications. More on this next time.

The meeting ended with Mary presenting Cathy Booth with a gift and a bottle of her favourite wine. She said Cathy was the one person who got us through the interregnum and had worked so hard. When the Archdeacon joined a PCC meeting to tell us what to do, we knew already and Cathy had done some of it.
