The Joy of Gardening

When I lived near Beckenham, the man next door, Mr Binnie, was an avid gardener. His garden was unremarkable for most of the year, but one day in May, you could open the curtains and be dazzled by the sight of next door, which was a riot of bedding plants in pink, red, purple, blue, yellow, and orange. An abundance of busy lizzies, petunias and begonias, lobelia and verbena, nasturtiums, fuchsias, all manner of baskets and containers surrounding a manicured lawn.

I was just discovering my own joy and love of gardening, following in my mum's footsteps, starting out with seeds on very hard clay soil, never terribly successful except for clarkia and marigolds, but Mr Binnie and I often chatted over the fence, and his favourite saying was "You are nearer God's heart in a garden, than anywhere else on earth." I didn't know then that it was from a poem by Dorothy Frances Gurney (1858 – 1932) but the quote often came into my head in later years as my gardening skills improved, and I discovered how much being in the garden is therapy, improving my mood and satisfying my creativity.

There are many references in the bible relating to growing seed, fruit and trees, the most well-known being the story of Creation and the Garden of Eden, when God planted trees that were "pleasing to the eye, and good for food". Many of Jesus's parables used examples of growing things, which his listeners would easily identify with; the parables of the Mustard Seed, the Sower, the Fig Tree, and the Vineyard, pruning the branches back to bear more fruit, and in Luke 12, we read of the beautiful lilies of the field as Jesus tells his disciples not to worry about what to eat or what to wear.

My garden is emerging from its winter dormancy. On a recent sunny day my eyes alighted on the little pink noses of peonies pushing through fallen leaves, hyacinths and daffodils already showing, hellebores aplenty with pink, purple, and white flowers, camellia buds swelling, even a rose bud near the kitchen wall, and a beautiful patch of glistening snowdrops lightening a shady corner, all harbingers of the Spring to come. The days get longer, and our gardens reward us with new life. Whether we have a window box or a few acres, we can marvel at the cycle of life, death, and rebirth, as we look towards Lent and Easter, reminding us of God's care and compassion.





There are 'Beware of the Toad' signs installed at three different points which are all about 100 metres from the T-junction between Church Way and Oast Road, and they will be uncovered from the beginning of February. These are the stretches of road where you are likely to come across the amphibians as they slowly make their way, up until about the beginning of April. Please, if you can, slow down as you drive there if it's between dusk and about 10pm during the migrating season.

We have a Toad Patrol, of all ages, to help the frogs and toads on their journey, and if you do drive slowly this will be safer for us too. Volunteers for the Toad Patrol are always most welcome. 

1. Complete one or more actions for nature at home or in the community.




