LENT GROUPS: Churches Together in Oxted & District (CTOD) have now decided to offer a Lent course called 'Journeys' which tackles the subject of modern slavery. Please sign up on the sheet on the table **by Sunday 23 February** if you would like to take part. Groups will begin in the week commencing 10 March.

There will also be a group using the course advertised in the February Newsletter (*The Sacraments: Responding to God's Loving Invitation*, by Jane Williams) running at The_Space, Oxted Community Hall, at 10am <u>starting on Monday 3 March</u>. Please speak to Janet Harman if you would like to join this group. You are very welcome to come whenever you can, even if not every week.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER, FRIDAY 7 MARCH: There are services at 10am at St John's and 7.30pm at St Mary's Oxted. This global ecumenical movement is led by Christian women who welcome you to join in prayer and action for peace and justice. This year's service comes from the women of the Cook Islands. The theme is 'I Made You Wonderful,' based on Psalm 139:1-18.

ELECTORAL ROLL: The Electoral Roll is a list of church members who wish to be identified with St John's as their church. It is quite separate from the Electoral Register (used for national and council elections etc). Those on the Roll may vote at annual church meetings and inclusion on it is a requirement for some roles in the church. The Electoral Roll has to be completely renewed every six years when all those already on it must reapply and others may join it for the first time. This was last done in 2019 so this year we need to run the exercise again.

Please look out for an envelope with your name on it which will be in church from the beginning of March. This will contain various pieces of information including an Electoral Roll application form for you to complete. The deadline for return of the form will be <u>Monday 14 April</u> so as to allow time for the new Electoral Roll to be drawn up before the church annual meeting in May. Please do seriously consider joining the Roll if you are not already on it. *Barbara Richards, St John's Electoral Roll Officer* **GENERAL SYNOD REPORT:** The General Synod is the national assembly of the Church of England. It considers and approves legislation affecting the whole of the Church of England, formulates new forms of worship, debates matters of national and international importance, and approves the annual budget for the work of the Church at national level. Helen Ainsworth, our representative on the General Synod, has provided a report of the recent meeting which received enormous coverage in the press and on television, not all of it strictly accurate. Please take a copy of her report from the table in church, which explains clearly some of the detail of the challenging subjects covered, such as safeguarding, and gives a flavour of the respect and care taken with these difficult decisions.

REMEDIAL WORK ON TREES: Last year, St John's arranged for a tree survey to be carried out in the church grounds as we had some concerns about some of the trees. The survey identified a number of issues and we have therefore engaged a local tree surgeon, Chartford Trees Ltd, to carry out the remedial work. This includes felling two diseased copper beeches and reducing the crowns of some of the other trees and removing deadwood from others. The work is scheduled to take place on Tuesday and Wednesday, 11 and 12 March.

The work will be noisy at times and there will be parts of the church grounds that will be temporarily cordoned off while the work is being carried out. If you need to attend the church during that time, please be guided by the contractors as to where you should park. If you have any concerns or would like to find out more about the work that is being undertaken, please speak to Jon Macartney and he will be pleased to help.

FROGS AND TOADS - UPDATE! Please continue to watch out for frogs and toads. At the time of writing (mid February) it has been too chilly for our amphibian friends to put in an appearance. Once the weather becomes milder, they'll probably leave it a day or two and then start the migration. Because the season will have begun later than previously, it could extend through to the end of March. Do remember to drive slowly on the roads approaching the church, particularly on mild, murky evenings from dusk until about 10pm, to avoid frogs and toads heading back to the pond where they were bred.
