ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING: At the APCM on 11 May we thanked Cathy Booth for all her work as Churchwarden; also Geoff Booth who has stepped down from his role as payroll adviser. We are so grateful to them for their dedicated service to St John's. Henk van den Berg was re-elected as Churchwarden please support him in this demanding role! Chris Johns was re-elected to the PCC and we also welcome new members, Sue Batley and Chris Long, both members of the Bubble Church team!

There was an update to the Giving part of the **Belong | Grow | Give** campaign. From the financial pledges returned: 9 people would like to increase their giving; 2 plan to decrease; 4 people who currently give by the Parish Giving Scheme will opt to increase yearly by inflation; 10 people intend to start regular giving. We estimate the monthly increase to be around £356 extra per month, which is £4,200 per year. We are very grateful to be able to make progress towards reducing the anticipated deficit of £10K. Thank you so much to everyone who responded and to everyone who contributes to St John's in so many different ways. The PCC will continue to look at our costs and fundraising initiatives.

MARY'S LENTEN DIVERTISSEMENT: Thank you to all who attended and supported Mary's Slide Shows during Lent. A total of £509.60 was raised (with Gift Aid, £637) from our visits to Iceland, The Galapagos, the Amazon, Alaska and New York/Cape Cod. That is a wonderful result, to go to church funds, and reflects an extremely generous response. Thank you so much.

TALK ON CLIMATE AND NATURE CRISES: On 21 May Ian Christie gave a very interesting talk on 'What is demanded of the affluent in the climate and nature crises of our time?'
