We had no idea who would come, but each month new people arrive, with a total of 20 families so far. It has a very spiritual feel as we end by waving 'goodbye' to the puppets, followed by the reminder that Jesus doesn't say goodbye, but is always with us. Keli Bolton from Bubble Church 'HQ' will join on 20 July to see how we are getting on and to support us going forward. There is no Bubble Church in August, with the next one on 21 September.



PCC REPORT: The new Parochial Church Council met for the first time on 26 June and welcomed the new members Sue Batley and Chris Long, both part of the 'core' Bubble Church team. After the formal appointments of people to particular roles, always done at the first meeting after the Annual Meeting, there was a long and wide ranging discussion on the governance structure and missional focus of the PCC and sub committees. It was noted that we are still waiting to hear the results of the applications to move the font and mount the cross with the chair plagues in the Lady Chapel.

HURST GREEN VILLAGE FAIR will take place on Saturday 20 September this year, 12.30 - 4pm. It has become traditional for St John's to provide a bouncy castle, but this year it will be bigger and better! Information on activities run by St John's will be available with helpers wearing the green T-shirts used for Bubble Church. The puppets may make an appearance too!
