## Welcome to St John's!

Did you know that that there were originally ten months in the ancient Roman calendar? It was based on lunar cycles and October was originally the eighth month of the year. Its name means "the eighth month" in Latin. In 451 BC the two months of Ianurarius and Februarius were added to the beginning of the calendar, making October the tenth month.

Today, we associate October with Harvest festivals, nights drawing in and the clocks going back an hour at the end of the month.

In Munich, Germany, October is associated with the Bavarian beer festival of Oktoberfest. We have our own version at St John's, with a beer tasting and chilli fundraising evening on Friday 10 October. There is an expert talk on the brewing process, different beers to taste and a homemade chill. Be sure to book your ticket in advance.

We will also be celebrating Harvest on 5 October and donating dried and tinned food to the Caterham foodbank. Everyone is welcome, we hope to see you soon.
