**Wednesday 26 November, 12 noon:** Eucharist, then soup lunch (usually every 4th Wednesday)


Sunday 30 November: Advent Sunday

MARGARET BAMFORD RIP: It was a shock for Margaret's many friends when she became unwell, then seriously ill and died within a relatively short time. We were suddenly faced with the realisation that we shall never enjoy her vibrant company again.

Margaret was highly respected and greatly loved. She will be remembered by a succession of students of Moor House School as their kindly and caring Matron. She and husband, John, were stalwarts of Hurst Green Methodist Church, Margaret was a Pastoral visitor, and they were saddened by the church's closure a few years ago. Margaret was a valued Trustee of the Oxted United Charities. Deeply thoughtful and knowledgeable, her favourite words were, 'It has occurred to me that we might do x, y, or z,' and they were always good ideas because she thought laterally. Above all, there was her practical help for neighbours in need. She and John were a formidable team, transporting people to the health centre or to hospital appointments, collecting prescriptions or doing shopping. Wherever there was a need, they were there.

We are so lucky to have known this active, sociable, cheerful and 'full of life' lady. She was a real treasure. May she rest in peace. A thanksgiving service for Margaret's life will be held at St John's Church on Thursday, 13 November, at 2.30 pm.

**RUTH VOWLES RIP:** We were sorry to hear of the death of Ruth Vowles. Ruth endeared herself to us when she moved here some years ago as partner to John Mills. She cheerfully engaged in many of our activities – services and coffee mornings, and thoroughly enjoyed being 'one of us'. She died peacefully in her Nailsworth home surrounded by her family in September.
