REPORT FROM THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL: The recent PCC meeting on 20 November was chaired by Henk van den Berg and covered the following:

<u>Mission Development Day</u> - You are all encouraged to join the PCC on Saturday 17 January 2026 9.30am-3pm (includes lunch) in THE_SPACE, Oxted Community Hall to discuss St John's future.

Work to display former chair plaques in the Lady Chapel will be carried out soon. They will be mounted on a cross using wood from the table currently in St John's Room; the church table will move into St John's Room. This will be replaced by a bespoke cabinet of a similar size, with storage, on wheels, so it can be moved.

<u>Health and Safety</u> - Chris Long, H&S Officer, highlighted some matters to be addressed. All four accidents recorded in 2025 involved people tripping up the step into the church (Chris Johns is to paint a white line to increase visibility of the step). The risk assessment for Yo Yos which is very out of date is being revised. The large numbers attending indicates the success of the popular baby and toddler group, but also presents a risk.

<u>Chris Johns, Fabric Officer</u> is also working on the installation of CCTV in the church, essential following recent thefts and attempted thefts causing damage; seeking an alternative way to display the Bubble Church banner which broke some stained glass

windows during a storm; and investigating how to deal with the damage to the carpet which will result when the font is moved.

Community Fridge: A new leader is sought; please speak to Ché Ramsden or Sue Bosley to find out more about what is involved.

Services to encourage young families: The monthly Bubble Church is growing, with many unchurched families attending and will include its first baptism in January. Numbers have also increased at All Age services with a new non-Eucharistic format, which uses some of the familiar ideas from Bubble Church.
